The discount will allow West Lafayette Schools to replace aging and end-of-life equipment. The following quotes include network infrastructure of the new school, overhaul of Cumberland Elementary, and replacement of the end-of-life phone servers and software at the Jr.Sr. High School and Central Office locations. Funding will be provided by the Common School Fund loans, Bonds and Capital Project Fund.

- New School \$279,151.82
- Cumberland \$179,515.20

- Jr. Sr. High School \$27,354
- Central Office \$13,895
