The Indiana School Boards Association, Region IV, awarded the West Lafayette Community School Corporation with a Commendable level of Indiana School Board Association Exemplary Governance Awards program for the calendar year of 2021. The WLCSC Board is intentional about and committed to continuous professional development and this marks our 20+ year as a Commendable Board.

VII. BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT REPORTS

Dr. Greiner - Congratulated the West Lafayette Wind Ensemble earned a coveted spot among 16 bands around the state.

Teacher Appreciation Week – on behalf of the Administration and School Board of Trustees, a sincere appreciation goes out to all of our educators for their dedication and commitment to education. Dr. Greiner reflected back on a teacher who made an impact on him and noted the importance of teachers in student's lives.

RFP Legal Services deadline has closed. Four proposals were received with one firm declining. A committee has been formed and will meet to review and discuss the applications.

Mr. Karpick - The Wall of Pride was held on April 7th and 8th. He commended Mrs. Ailor and Mr. Schott for their time and effort with this remarkable event.

Graduation is scheduled for Friday, May 27th at 7 p.m., and thirty-two scholarships, totaling \$33,000, will be awarded at a reception prior to graduation.

- Mr. Marley Economic Development Commission approved a 5-year tax abatement on personal property and investment relating to the expansion of the Rolls Royce plant operation (which is outside the WLCSC taxing district).
- Mr. Schott The second semester teacher grants were received and awarded five applications/five grants totaling about \$8000.

The Senior Legacy Project at the JSHS will be a flag mural that will replace the flags that hung in the cafeteria area.

Homecoming will be held September 9, 2022 with more information forthcoming.

Dr. Springer -The Parks and Recreation Board, eighty people provided input to the Happy Hollow Park survey which was conducted in March. The survey was designed to receive public input on

additional activities. The survey was a joint effort between the West Lafayette Parks and Recreation Department and a Purdue Anthropology Professor.

The fourth and final G.L.A.S.S. governing board meeting for the school year was held on April 19th. G.L.A.S.S. did receive the Federal American Rescue Plan Funding for school age children at \$1.3 million dollars. The money has to be expended by September 30, 2023 with the funds going to certified and non-certified staff, special education training, an additional nurse, behavioral therapist, conference travel, supplies, technology, etc.

G.L.A.S.S. has many certified staff openings for the 2022-2023 school year. If anyone is interested, please contact G.L.A.S.S. for more information.

Board/Teacher discussion was held on April 21, 2022. Discussion included an update concerning student transportation, two professional development days for 2022-23 and new legislative requirements related to E-Learning.

The policy committee continues to meet every two to three weeks to work on policy revisions that are mandated by the Federal Government and Indiana State Law.

Mrs. Austin – The Tippecanoe Foundation continues to work on the upcoming cupcake walk.

The Legislative Session is out of session.

Community Council will return in the fall of 2022.
