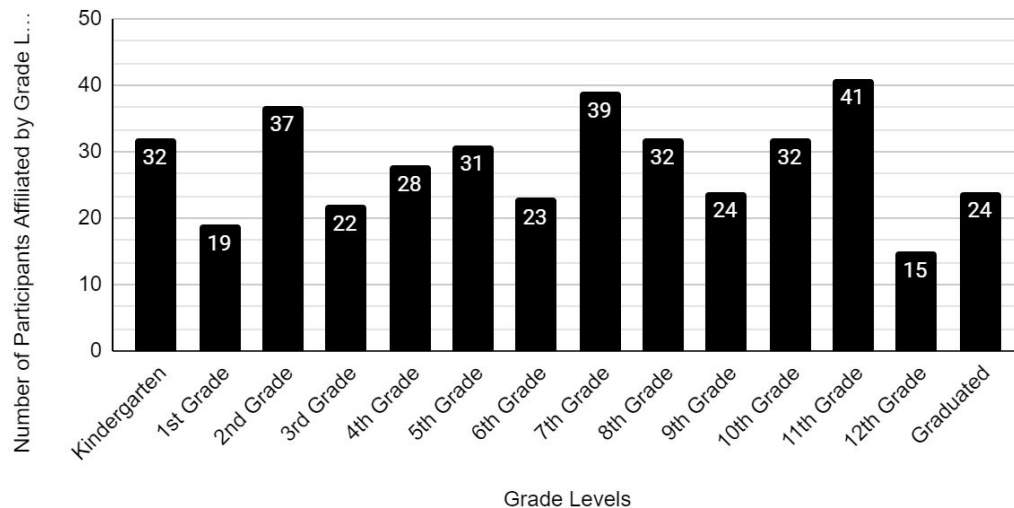

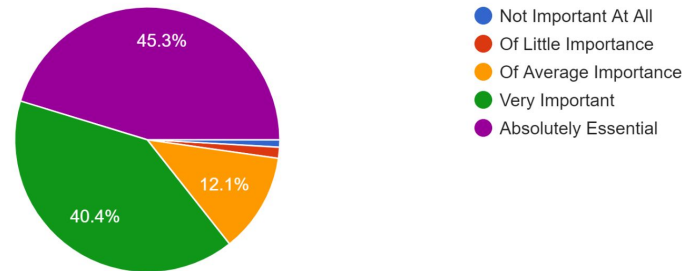

Academics

74 Comments (85.7% Essential or Very Important)

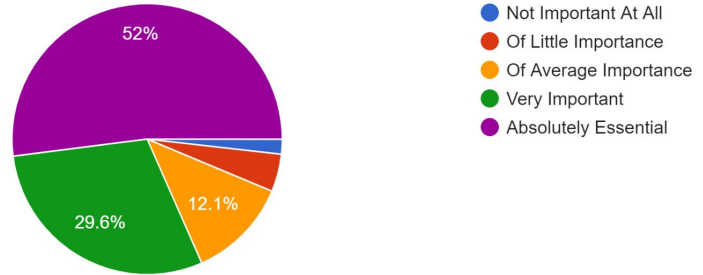
- The curriculum audit can help understand learning opportunities and supports available for students of all achievement and growth levels
- There is interest in allowing for “skipping” of courses or grade levels through testing or other demonstrated proof of ability and achievement. The greatest emphasis was on flexibility in skipping math.
- Technology is viewed as a supplement (not a replacement) for high-quality instruction. There is great support for placing emphasis on teachers and quality instruction as central to academic achievement.



Whole Child

67 Comments (81.6% Essential or Very Important)

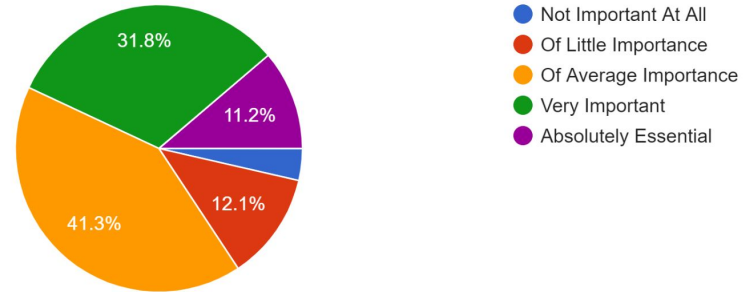
- Mental health and social-emotional well-being are critical; efforts should continue in this area.
- Awareness of mental-health issues and resources are important for families, teachers and students; more efforts in this area are needed.
- Efforts in diversity, equity and inclusion should continue; it is important to look at diversity through race, economic status and disability status.

55 Comments (43% Essential or Very Important)

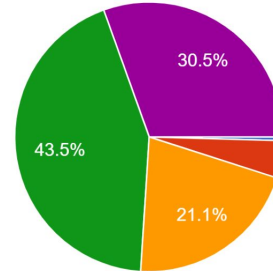
- Making a decision regarding the future of Happy Hollow is important to the community.

- Financial transparency and accountability are important to the community.

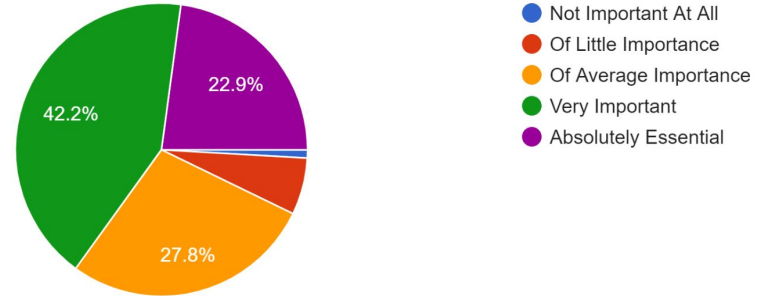
